1. Notice to men quartered in gymnasium: The small gym is not to be used at any time by any aviation students until the men quartered in the large gym have been moved out. This is the only gym that the college students have available for their use and it will be used by the Army only for supervised Physical Training during the day.

In addition, men quartered in the gym will use the back stairways to the shower rooms during the day. The doors down the hall on the second floor will be kept closed.

- 6. Effective immediately: Brass buckles are authorized for all A/S. In the very near future it will become a prescirbed item of uniform. Consequently all students should try to procure them while on Open House Day.

7. Students are directed to note the following supplement to the standing orders concerning "Popping to attention" when meeting an officer in the hallways: They will not only come to attention, but will come to attention with their back against the wall. Note that this applies to hallways only, particularly in the barracks. In all other situations they will come to attention and make way so that the officers can get thru the group. - 1. Effective tomorrow A/S Pellicone, J. L. and A/S Monroe, W. G. will take mathematics with Flight 46 in Room 328 (instead of their own Flight 38 in Room 327). The Flight leader of Flight 46 will carry them on his roster for that class only; the flight leader of Flight 38 will continue to carry them and note them as "Special Excuse". These men will march to Math class with Flight 38 and upon arrival, fall into Class with Flight 46; upon departure they will rejoin Flight 38.
- 2. Effective immediately and permanently, unless circumstances reasonably prevent, flights will arrive at Class four minutes before class time. Upon arrival in each class during the day, the flight lieutenant must take a new roll call. See Training Memo # 34, Par 3 for re-check on procedure.
- 3. Those 12 Jewish men who duly returned their names to the Training Department through their flight lieutenants and O.D. will be granted open post as follows: Sep 29: 1800 to 2200; Sep 30 0800 to 2200. No others are eligible. Next week there will be additional time on Friday and Saturday, times to be announced later.
- 4. All students expecting incoming local calls must acquaint their callers with the number of the public phones in the Day Rooms. Effective at once, the Officer of the Day's detail will refuse to either call students to the phone or to give the public phone number to callers. In the case of long distance calls, discretion rest with the OD to grant use of the phone to the students. That applies to incoming long distance calls; outgoing calls will never be made over the official phone. In addition, "fishing expedition" calls by women for just about any available students will be responded to in a curt manner; these calls are not only unauthorized bu distinctly undestreable.
- 5. Mr. Hehir will arrange to have captains elected of all squadron and flight basketball teams and such names to be presented to the Commanding Officer as soom as
- 6. Mr. Lemaresquier is again asked to present a list of present members of the Homer Council to the Commanding Officer as soon as possible.

5. Inspection order of the Halls and Latrines has been consistently in a highly unsatisfactory state. It is understood that supplies of brushes, brooms, mops, scouring powders, soaps, and dustcloths have been inadequate due to governmental purchasing problems. It is, however, expected that students will exercise resourcefulness in purchasing small items like scouring powder and dustcloths themselves in the meantime; regardless of obstacles, it is part of the military training that the job will be done. To implement this, the following rules go into effect:

1. No A/S will leave bottles, brooms and trash in the hall, but will keep

it in his room until morning and then take it directly to the proper receptacles.

2. No A/S will deposit his dirty linens in the hall on Saturday mornings; instead it will be left in his room and picked up there by the designated person of the flight.

3. Mops will be rinsed and dried outside. Rooms mopped with a dirty mop invite demerits; no mop will clean unless it has itself been cleaned.

4. In addition to giving demerits to the orderly, any room adjacent to a particularly dirty part of the hall will also be given demerits.

5. The Hall-Latrine Orderly is given the authority to make Delinquency Reports in his own name for that day he is on duty. He will report any room orderly of rooms that sweep trash or bottles into the hall; he will report any other member of the detail who does not participate promptly and completely in cleaning the hall and latrine; he will report any person who enters the latrine during or after the latrine is being cleaned:

6. Insistence upon clean halls and latrines will go on. The Orderly is to be given demerits whenever uncleanliness is shown; it is to his self-interest to exercise the authority herein granted.
