Minor Curriculum Revisions

The following minor revisions were approved:

Change in course number for Media Education, History of Books,
and Printing from 490 (g) to 290.

Change in number of credit hours for Music 414(g), Techniques
of Musical Interpretation from 3 cr. to 1-3 cr.

Change in title from Piano Major to Keyboard Major

Add (g) designation to Sociology 312, Sociology of Complex
Organizations.

French 403

J. Holland moved, Molly Moore seconded, to approve French 403, Selected
Emphasis in Applied French, 3 cr. Motion carried unanimously.

American Studies 317, 340, 419

Maximum Credit Load for Graduate Students

J. Kaplan moved, P. Szeitz seconded, to approve the following proposal: The
maximum credit load for full-time graduate students be established at 15 hours,
with any excess possible only upon approval by the graduate dean. Motion
carried.
