OLAF JENSEN HAGEN

Dr. Olaf Jensen Hagen served on the Minnesota State College Board for eight years, from 1923 to 1931, and was Resident Director for Moorhead State College. During those years the college graduated its first four year degree students, and the college high school graduated its first class.

Dr. Hagen was born in Menomonie, Wisconsin, on September 16, 1872. He attended public school in Richland County, North Dakota. First attending college at the State Normal School in St. Cloud, Minnesota, he later attended Valparaiso University in Indiana, and the medical school of the University of Minnesota. His post graduate work was done at Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, at Harvard, and at the University of Berlin.

Dr. Hagen has distinguished himself as an outstanding educator, surgeon, and humanitarian. In addition to his long and faithful service to Moorhead State College, he has been a county and local school superintendent, a college instructor, and a school board member. He has also been a member of the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota, and president of the National Association of Governing Boards of State Universities and Allied Institutions.

His achievements in the field of medicine are internationally known. He has written many articles in medicine and surgery, and is a founder and former president of the Fargo Clinic in Fargo, North Dakota.

Dr. Hagen has lived in Moorhead since beginning the practice of medicine. In 1911 he was married to Miss Moselle Weld, a daughter of Dr. Frank A. Weld, who for twenty years served as president of the State Normal School at Moorhead. Dr. Hagen has always been a leader in community activities and is held in high esteem by his colleagues and fellow citizens. It is most appropriate that the new Science and Industrial Arts Building be named "Hagen Hall" in honor of this outstanding scientist and citizen.
