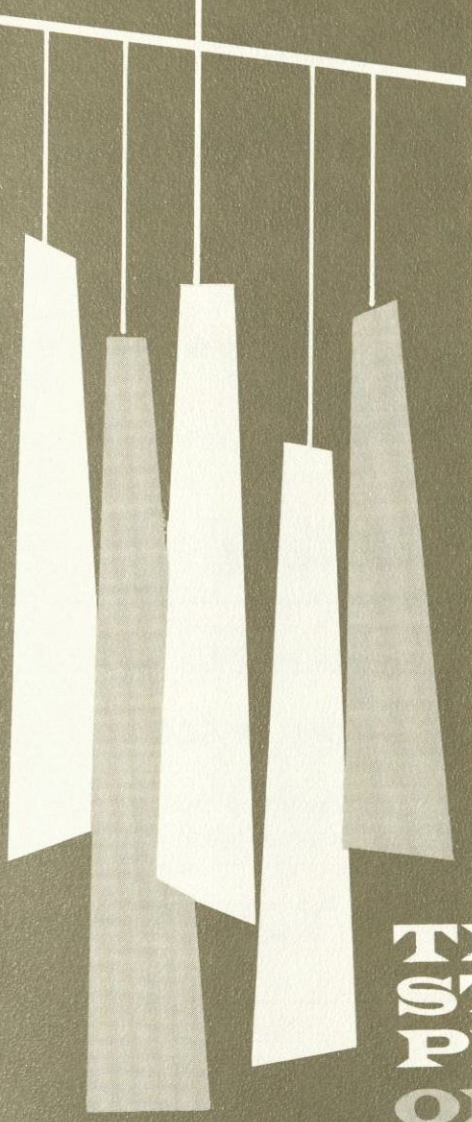

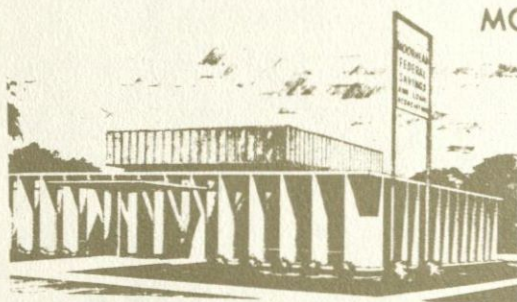

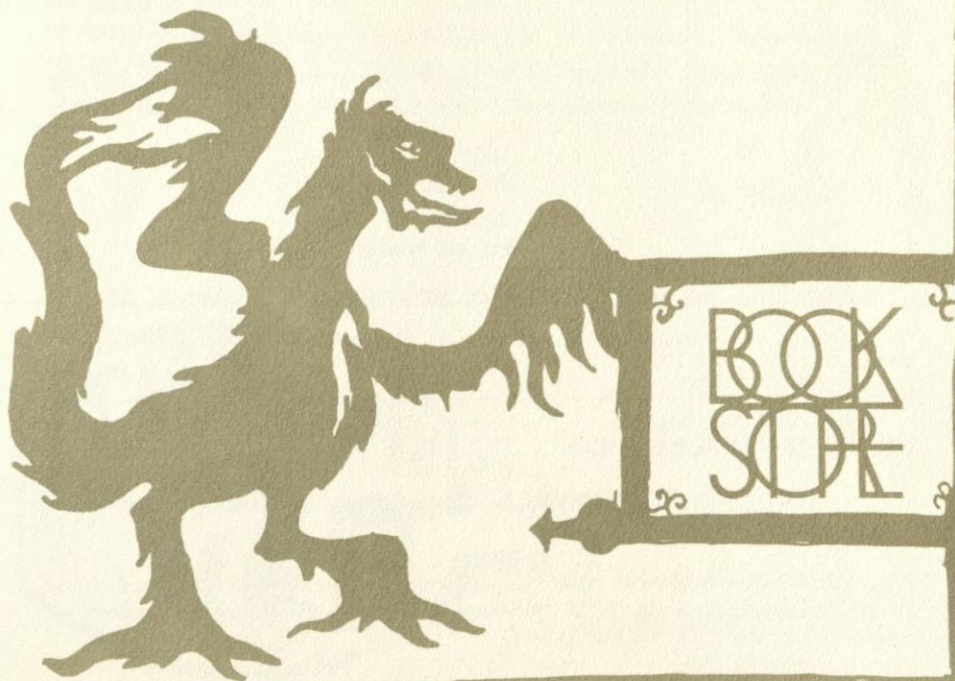

A Gothic mystery-thriller in which an unstable housekeeper becomes enmeshed in embezzlement and murder as she struggles to save her eccentric sisters from a nineteenth century mental institution.

NOTES ON THE PLAY—

My play, *THE LARK*, makes no attempt to explain the mystery of Joan of Arc.

The persistent efforts of so-called modern minds to explain mysteries is, in any case, one of the most naive and foolish activities indulged in by the puny human brain since it became overstocked with shallow political and scientific notions, and can yield nothing, in the long run, but the nostalgic satisfaction of the small boy who discovers at last that his mechanical duck was made up of two wheels, three springs and a screw. The little boy holds in his hands three springs, two wheels, and a screw, objects which are doubtless reassuring, but he has lost his mechanical duck and he has usually not found an explanation.

Some nights, when I am feeling depressed, I try to be rational and I say: the situation — social, political, and military — was ripe for the phenomenon of Joan. But I still cannot explain her, anymore than I can explain the tiniest flower growing by the wayside. There's just a little living flower that has always known, ever since it was a microscopic seed, how many petals it would have and how big they would grow, exactly how blue its blue would be and how its delicate scent would be compounded. There's just the phenomenon of Joan, as there is the phenomenon of a daisy or of the sky or of a bird. What pretentious creatures men are, if that's not enough for them.

Children, even when they are growing older, are allowed to make a bunch of daisies or play at imitating bird-song, even if they know nothing about botany or ornithology. That is just about what I have done in *THE LARK*.

A wildly funny comedy hit by one of America's finest theatrical humorists about a bachelor dentist who sets out to maintain his bachelor status only to be tripped up in a device of his own making.

ABOUT THE PLAY —

Mystery plays are fairy tales for grownups; in our enjoyment of them we relive our childhood experiences—the fears they arouse are the echoes of fears we felt when we were very young, the suspense they create is the same heart-thumping agony we went through when we waited anxiously for the ending of a hair-raising tale told after the sun went down. The wise writer of thrillers draws on the emotion of fear as his stock-in-trade and he creates his suspense by gradually exciting the playgoer's curiosity through enigmatic hints, half-sentences, and the inexplicable actions of seemingly stable characters. Through suggestion, an atmosphere is created where even the most incredible events seem credible.

True horror, fortunately, is a rare experience for most of us. We may be frightened, horrified, or even awestruck upon occasion, but a man may live out his whole life even in these extraordinary troubled times and never come face to face with horror in his waking moments. To this end, the one most fertile field for the dramatist to explore is the uncertain area lying along the edge of sanity where unhinged reason revels with the prodigies of its own spawning.

Our play, *LADIES IN RETIREMENT*, explores this region on the brink of madness. The scene is laid in the living room of an old house on the marshes of the Thames estuary, some ten miles east of Gravesend. In such a setting, as wild and lonely as any of the foggy dunes over which the hound of the Baskervilles roamed in Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's day, it is inevitable that murder should be done. Threat hangs over the imperiled heads of the characters as a formidable housekeeper moves with uncanny skill to conceal her crime. Blending humor with the macabre, our play seeks to join the host of mystery thrillers which have excited mystery fans in the past.

A theatrically startling comedy by one of England's most promising young dramatists; "a chillingly black comedy" which savagely reveals the torment behind a marriage torn apart by a handicapped child.

NOTES ON THE PLAY. . . .

Carson McCullers' warm and affectionate character study, *THE MEMBER OF THE WEDDING*, was awarded the Drama Critics' Circle Award as "the best play of the year" when it was originally produced in 1950. After twenty years of theatrical life, the poignant tale remains a landmark in American drama as well as in American fiction. Miss McCullers' territory is the childish heart and her landscape is filled with the ordinary things of existence which chafe and hurt her gentle misfits. It is a world peopled with outsiders who fail to connect, who remain separated—often because of their own inability to see but more frequently because of the blindness of others.

This separation is expressed memorably in *THE MEMBER OF THE WEDDING*, a brilliant evocation of childhood longing and sorrow reflected through the eyes of a gawky adolescent and the only mother she has ever known, the family cook. In a ramshackle kitchen in a small Georgia town, the destinies of both are worked out as the wild whirling impulses of the girl on tip-toes with eagerness for a world she does not know how to take part in is guided compassionately toward adulthood by the cook whose maternal wisdom has been drawn from her remembrance of the past. Maturity comes for the lonely girl but only after author McCullers has gently dissected the illusions by which she lived her youth.

The play itself is also a misfit; it remains a unique drama of genuine individuality. Dealing with intangible qualities, which are difficult to capture in theatrical form, the play has a strange, haunting and delicate kind of rueful beauty rarely found on the contemporary American stage. Its humor, simplicity, and anguish are best summed up in Miss McCullers' description of her lonely heroine: "This was the summer when for a long time Frankie Addams had not been a member. She belonged to no club and was no member of nothing in the world. Frankie had become an unjoined person who hung around in doorways, and she was afraid."

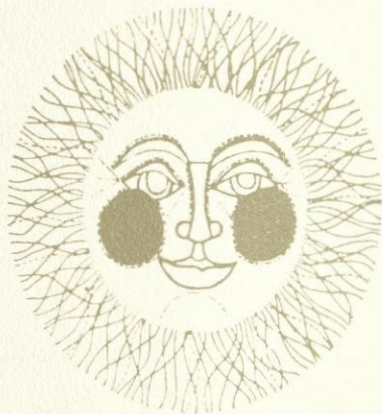

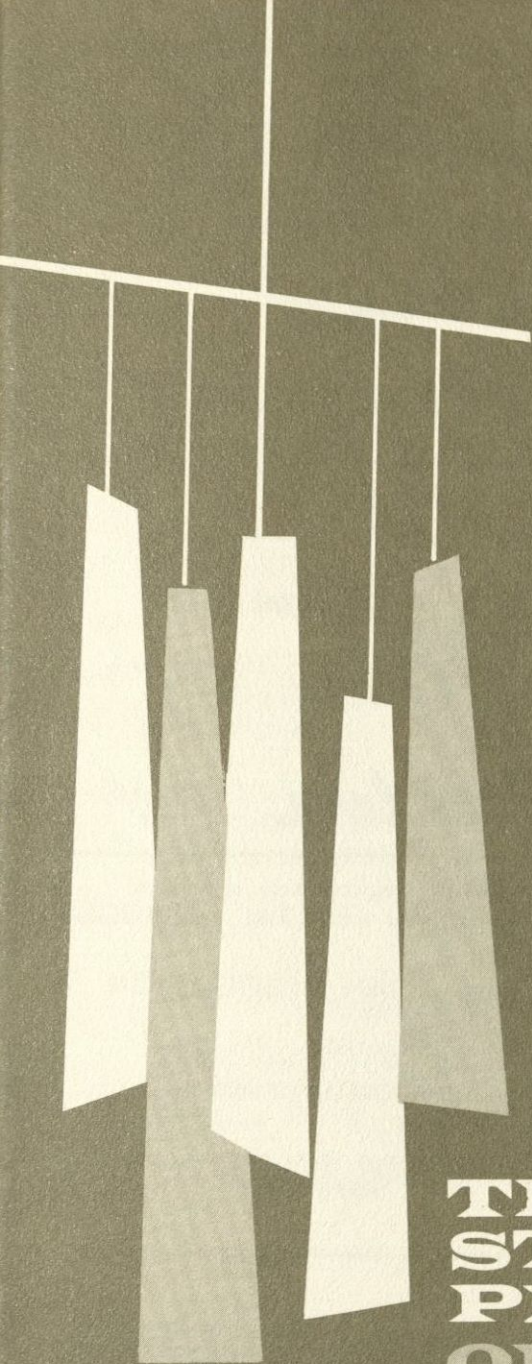

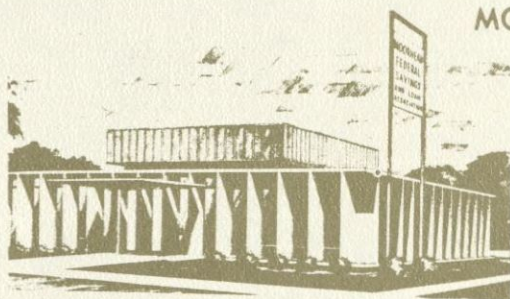

An absorbing drama by one of America's most distinguished playwrights which probes with deep compassion and gentle humor the disquieting alienation between a father and son despite the good intentions of both men.

THE JEST IN "JOE EGG" – AND THE ACHE

JOE EGG would seem to be unlikely material for the theatre. In point of fact, it could not quite exist anywhere else. It is the theatre as circus, with a shaggy-haired husband ready to interrupt the play with witty diatribes at any time; the theatre as vaudeville, with a tormented wife breaking into intimacy with her audience; the theatre as improvisation, with young husband and wife tucking their spastic child away for a moment so they can pretend to be Viennese doctors diagnosing a hopeless case.

Peter Nichols' restlessly original and recklessly touching new "comedy," is based on the author's own experience as the father of a small daughter with a hopelessly damaged cortex. It is written as though a badly mauled but game lion-tamer were cracking his whip. The ringside devices used by author Nichols are neither decoration nor distraction; they are the essence of the play, the key to its people, the precise and necessary description of the quality of a shared life. For this small-time school teacher and his wife cannot possibly deal with their problem head-on; there is no head-on solution to the existence of a loved child that will never be anything better than a fair-skinned rag doll. They must turn life into theatre in an effort to cope with it. They must turn themselves into performers in order to survive.

And so they do, jauntily, wittily, inventively, openly, making a wry jest of hope and a bond of their candor. At every level of existence they hear a fanfare that must be honored. The spotlight is on and when it is very white and very harsh, the only thing to be done is to adopt a naked clown's face, play out the turn, and clasp hands for applause. While the theatrical banter is first cruel, then humorous, and finally touching, the bruised hearts of the young couple continue to ring with the cozy words of the physician: "Take her home, she won't be any trouble, you'll hardly know she's there."

WHY CAN'T I FEEL ANYTHING?

I have sometimes thought that when the 20th century is finally represented by a single piece of statuary in a very long corridor in the Museum of Time, the image it will leave us as a legacy will be that of a perfectly decent-looking man, rather youngish, with his face screwed up in a small spasm of bewilderment and self-doubt, cracking his knuckles and staring outward vacantly because he is really staring inward, repeatedly asking himself, "Why can't I feel anything?"

In short, he will look rather as the son does in Robert Anderson's *I NEVER SANG FOR MY FATHER*. He begins the evening by coming toward us--he must confide in someone and we, perhaps, are history--to speak in a low-keyed, candid, honestly reflective but faintly fussed way about an emotional relationship he cannot, never could, bring into being. For as long as he can remember he has wished to love his father. No, that is not the right way to put it. He has wished to feel love for his father. The old man is near death now. The feeling won't come.

And this may be the nub of the whole matter. In the 20th century we are inclined to feel guilty unless we can respond, with every pore open and every nerve quivering, to each and every opportunity for love. Because those opportunities are infinite we are certain to wind up frustrated, accusing ourselves of heartlessness, nagging at our psyches because emotion won't always come. It is not even love we are after. Love just might consist of knowing and then doing, understanding and acting generously toward what is understood. What we demand of ourselves is the sensation of loving, a ready tingle of the flesh, a tickle at the stomach, a warm and gratifying glow that stirs in us and suffuses the whole body until the body is persuaded that it is totally involved, totally sensitive, all athrob with participation.

When we feel less than we feel we ought to feel (you see how complex the matter is), are we being hard-hearted or are we only harassing ourselves? Above all, what are we focusing on, the figure in need of care or the interior reassurance of caring? It's a puzzle, and a universal pressure. The pressure may in the end create contemporary man's most recognizable stance; a faint cringing in fear of not having felt absolutely everything.
