Following the game, the Homecoming dance was held in the college gymnasium. Music for the dance was provided by Red Sather and his orchestra.

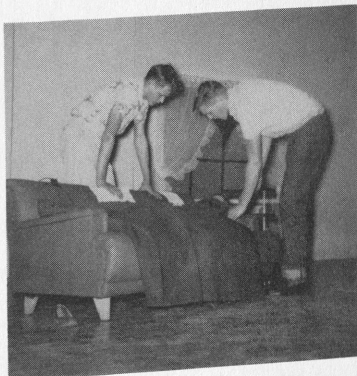
