BABY DRAGONS HAVE SUCCESSFUL SEASON WITH 6-0-1 RECORD

The Baby Dragons, under Coach Don Anderson, who returned after a year's absence, had another successful season, being undefeated and tied only once. The highlight of the season was the 57-20 win over the Ulen Panthers, who until that time had won 16 games in a row. The Baby Dragons also won the Little Valley Conference championship, their fourth in seven years.

The team was credited with very fine running throughout the year. Junior halfback Don Jones led the team in rushing, with 766 yards, and in scoring, with 96 points. Denny Orvedahl and Seniors LeRoy Johnson, Jim Meland, and Art Bannerman did their share of the running for the Baby Dragons.

The team this year had the best line in the conference as they held their opposition to 1086 yards rushing while the offensive unit piled up 1728 yards. Led by Seniors Gary Heisler, Al Sather, Dick Anderson, Dick Bannerman, and Darrel Grande, and Juniors Rick McLaughlin, Denny Kragnes, Jerry Beedy, and John Emerson, the line threw opposition for repeated losses throughout the season.

Two other games that held significance were the homecoming game against Lake Park, which was won by MSC High School 35-0, and the Glyndon game, which was the first eleven-man football game played at MSC High School in twenty years. The Baby Dragons won very handily by the score of 32-14.
