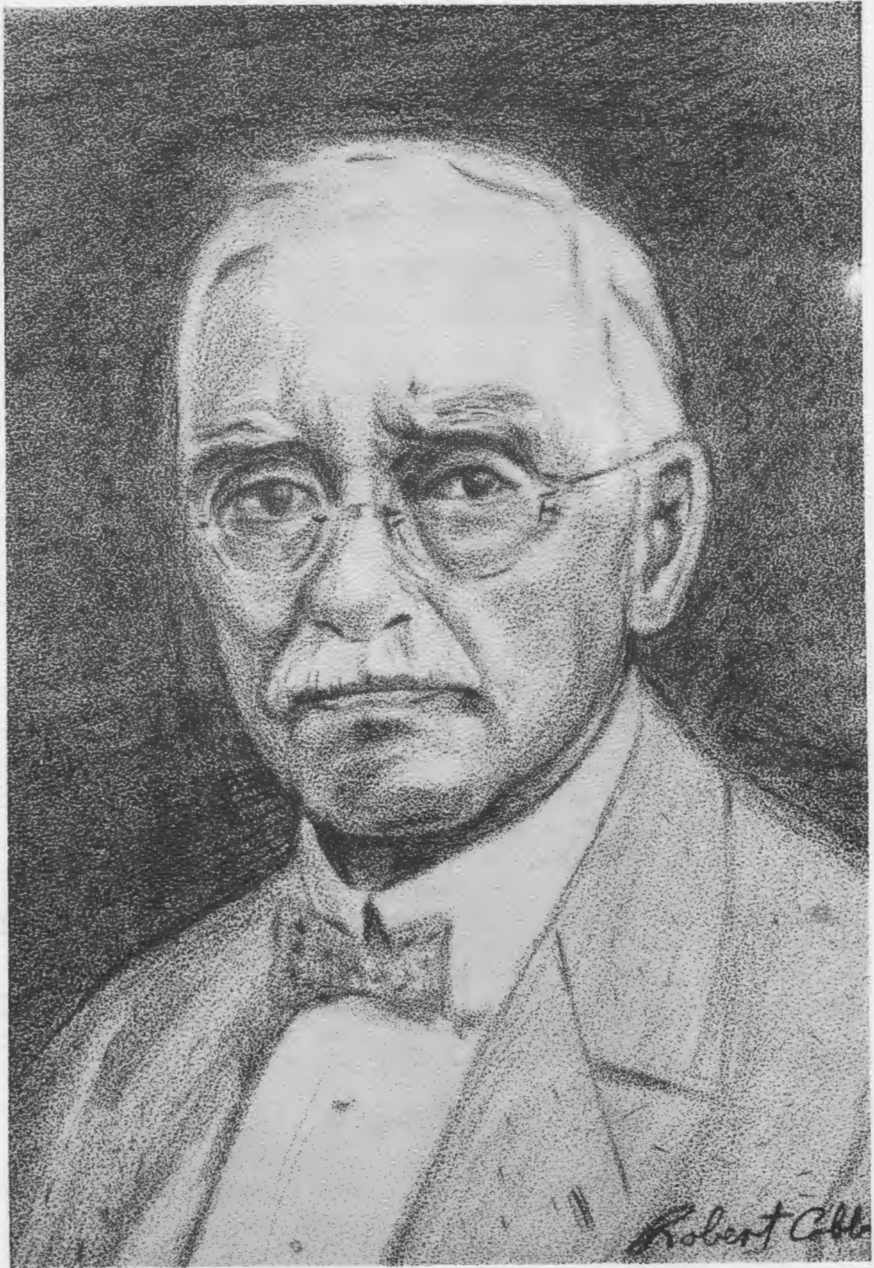

First President of the Moorhead Normal School

1888-1899
