


MOORHEAD STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE TRAINING SCHOOL OLD MAIN 1918 to 1930

Miss Georgiana Lommen

Miss Lommen gave most of the many years of her life to the continuation and development of education. She, as first director of the Campus School, devoted much of her time and talents to help make the Campus School the educational institution it has been and is.

Miss Lommen was born October 28, 1877, in Caledonia, Minnesota. She taught many years in rural schools in and around her birth place of Caledonia.

She received her B.S. degree in Education from the University of Minnesota in 1918 and received her M.A. degree in Education from Columbia University in New York in 1920.

Miss Lommen became director of the Campus School in 1923 and resigned in 1943. She was also very active in Fargo-Moorhead civic activities, such as F.M. Opera Forum. Many people who have attended the Campus School were not personally acquainted with Miss Lommen. Many people will remember the Campus School; but we, the last students of M.S. High, dedicate the Historical Section of the 1971 Annual to her memory, in the knowledge that through her efforts the Campus School remained possible.

Miss Lommen is a women of strength, not only physically but mentally and spiritually. She guided the school through those hard and trying first years of the school's growth.
























































































In Dedication to Miss Ragna Holen

Miss Ragna Holen, as head of the Home Economics Department, has played an important part in the life of the Campus School and of the College. The boys as well as the girls have benefited from her classes, learning not only how to buy, prepare and serve foods, but also to understand some of the problems of family living.

As chairman of both the Campus School and the College Social Committees, she has given freely of her time for social functions. In addition to her regular teaching, Miss Holen and her home economics department have provided a service center, dispensing varied materials and information.

She has planned all of the hot lunch menus in the Campus School since the program was started. For the last seven years she has been chairman of a committee awarding the Lyl Solem Scholarships to Campus School graduates.






But we lie quieter now, older, arms pressed out against darkness.
