Minor Curriculum Revisions

The following minor curriculum revisions were approved:

Change prerequisite for Math 211, Applied Business Calculus from Math 121 or equivalent to Math 273 and change catalog description to: Differential calculus of one and several variables. Introduction of integral calculus. Applications to business problems. Prerequisite: Math 273. Not suitable for science majors and not open to students who have completed Math 231.

German 100 will be offered on an experimental basis during the spring quarter only for one (1) credit, under the course title LANG LAB PRACTICE.

Long Range Planning Subcommittee Report

The recommendations of the Long Range Planning Subcommittee were discussed. L. Grugel moved, M. Moore seconded, that an APAC subcommittee be appointed, by the chairperson, to draft a workable charge for the Long Range Planning Subcommittee. Motion carried.

Management 452(g)

M. Holoien moved, D. Gasal seconded, to approve Management 452(g), Organization Development (4). Motion carried.

Recommendation from Liberal Arts Subcommittee for a policy on the cross-listing of courses applicable to the Liberal Arts

L. Grugel moved, D. Corrick seconded, to approve the recommendation from the Liberal Arts subcommittee. M. Holoien moved, A. Mudgett seconded, to amend the recommendation as follows:

Given criterion 9C, page 13 of the Report of the Liberal Arts Subcommittee ("The course should be a good representative of the characteristic subject matter, methodology and overall academic approach of the discipline concerned"), a course can be approved for Liberal Arts designation only in the employing department of the instructor. For example, Philosophy of Art is offered under Philosophy 320 and Art 320. Since the course originates in the Philosophy department and is representative of that discipline, it would be acceptable for Liberal Arts only as a Philosophy course, not as an Art course.

Motion to amend carried. Motion to approve the recommendation as amended failed.

University cross-listing policy

L. Grugel moved, D. Corrick seconded, that the cross-listing policy be examined. Motion carried.
