OPPORTUNITIES AT YOUR STATE COLLEGE. In selecting a college, a student wants to know four things—what courses are offered, what chances there are for participation in activities, what chances there are to fit into the social, cultural, and religious life of the college community, and last, how much it costs to attend.

As to courses, a student at M. S. T. C. may specialize in such fields as social science, physical education, music, English, French, physical science, art, industrial arts, geography, psychology, education, and mathematics. It is impossible to give complete information as to courses and curricula in this folder. If you have not received a copy of the catalog, ask for one. Address The Registrar, State Teachers College, Moorhead, Minnesota.

Activities. The Dragons put strong football and basketball teams into competition against such schools as North Dakota University, Concordia, North Dakota State, River Falls, Aberdeen, and the colleges of the Northern State Teachers Conference. But athletic competition is not only for a few football and basketball stars. Teams are organized in track, baseball, swimming, tennis, golf, hockey, boxing, wrestling, kickball, archery, and all the usual sports for both men and women.

Music at the Teachers College takes in almost everybody who wants to sing or play. Bands, orchestras, choirs, and glee clubs for men and women give a chance to all. Regularly enrolled students may, upon meeting standard requirements, earn college credit in voice, chorus, band, orchestra, piano, choir, stringed, brass, woodwind, or percussion instruments. Bring your musical instrument along when you come.

Dramatics and debate are other activities that play an important part at Moorhead. The Seniors have their own class play. Freshmen take part in a series of one-act plays every year, and the Dramatic Club, open to membership by tryouts, together with Alpha Psi Omega, one of the three national honor fraternities on the campus, presents an annual production.

Debaters from the College met almost all colleges of the northwest states last year in tournaments and on tours. Places on the teams are open to all students, men and women.

Journalism is a strong activity, with a weekly newspaper, a yearbook, and other minor publications to give opportunities for students in all classes by means of open tryouts.

Besides all these special activities there are many clubs, some open to all, some elective, and some honorary, for those interested in art, French, education, English, geography, country life, women's athletics, international relations, mathematics, and so forth. There are six purely social clubs, four for women and two for men.

Whatever your religious denomination or preference may be, there is a chance for you to affiliate yourself with religious groups on the campus or downtown in Moorhead and Fargo. Nobody needs to be left out of these activities.

A Friendly School. One of the best phases of a college the size of Moorhead State Teachers is that all students have a chance to participate in the social life of the school. They soon get acquainted with many others among the student body and the faculty and find events planned for their benefit by the Student Commission, beginning with the first day of school in the fall. M. S. T. C. has a reputation for being a friendly place.

If you plan to stay at one of the three dormitories, bring only towels, one extra blanket, dresser covers and any other decorative pieces you desire to use. Everything else is furnished. Board may be had by either men or women in the College Dining Hall on a non-profit basis. Those who wish to stay at private homes should see the next page of general information.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Admission

All persons wishing to enroll in the Moorhead State Teachers College should make application for admission upon a blank provided for the purpose. This application including the official transcript of high school records and certificate of character should be filed with the registrar of the college at least ten days before the opening of the quarter. It is recommended that the application should also include a physician's certificate of recent vaccination. The blank "Application for Admission" will be mailed on a request sent to the registrar of Moorhead State Teachers College.

Conference Day and Registration

Tuesday of the opening week is Conference Day for those students entering for the first time. Upper classmen will see the proper faculty adviser for the purpose of checking transferred credits. All freshmen are expected to be present in the Auditorium by 9:00 A. M. of this day. A program of tests, adjustment of credits, searching for rooms, conference with faculty advisers, and social affairs combine to make the day helpful and interesting to the new student, and will eliminate much of the confusion attendant on the first registration at college.

Living Accommodations

Wheeler and Comstock are two comfortable, homelike residences for women, and the men's hall offers accommodations for twenty-six men. These halls are centers of student life, and offer the joys of fine friendships and happy companionship. Reservations for rooms are made only when accompanied by a fee of five dollars. If reservations are cancelled before August 15 the deposit will be refunded.

Students desiring rooms off-campus must secure those rooms from the approved lists in the offices of the dean of men and dean of women.
