Revision in Physics Major

The following revisions in the Physics Major were approved: Drop Math 365 (4 cr.)--Add ComS 201-202 (8).

LART 322

M. Moore moved, R. Bynum seconded, to approve Speech 322, (4) with the title: Rhetoric in Vindication. Motion carried.

LART 320

R. Bynum moved, M. Moore seconded, to approve LART 320, Sport and American Culture (4). The vote was 5-5-1. Dr. Jones stated he would let the vote stand and would consult with those who voted against the motion before making a recommendation to the President.

LART 318

S. Roy moved, W. Peck seconded, to approve LART 318, Energy Issues (4). Motion carried.

Size of Majors

The motion regarding size of majors was removed from the table:

1. That B.S. programs permit a minimum of 24 credits of free electives and that B.A. programs permit a minimum of 48 credits of free electives.

2. That adherence to the numbers above be required, not discretionary. Motion to approve was defeated 4-7.
