Mathematics

Margaret Moore moved, M. Hansel seconded, to table the increase in credits for Math 344, Mathematics for Special Education, until additional information is provided. Motion to table carried 7-4.

M. Hansel moved, D. Scott seconded, to approve an increase in credits from 3 to 4 for Math 133, Trigonometry. Motion carried unanimously.

Business Education

E. Alberts moved, J. Snyder seconded, to approve "G" designation for Business Education 420, Integrated Microcomputer Business Applications. Motion was defeated 4-7. The course will be returned to the Graduate Council for further review.

Anthropology

D. Scott moved, M. Hansel seconded, to approve Anthro 360, Economic Anthropology, for Liberal Arts Designation--Division C. Motion carried unanimously.

Social Work

E. Alberts moved, P. Beare seconded, to approve the addition of Sp Ed 320, Educational Services for Exceptional Individuals (4), to the courses required in related areas for the Social Work major. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Scott moved, J. Snyder seconded, that the 16 credit internship in Social Work be required in a school setting for school social workers. Motion carried unanimously.
