APAC Minutes
(October 19, 1993)

Present: Midgarden, Chair; Badal, Barden, Bense, Crockett, Debaji, Frederick, Gracyk, Moore, Papenfuss, Peil, Pratt, Reed, Roy, Schmider, Schobel, Strong, Swenson

1. Gracyk moved, Moore seconded to approve the proposed Moorhead State University Mission Statement.

Schobel moved to amend Aims/Item 9 from "To provide support and encouragement for faculty development including scholarship, creative activity, research and public service that enriches the individual and the institution, and that promotes the educational and economic development of the service region" to, "To provide encouragement for faculty development including scholarship, creative activity, research and public service that enriches the individual and the institution, and that promotes the educational and economic development of the service region." Motion to amend died for lack of a second.

Motion carried unanimously

2. Geography/Geology

- a. Minor change announced: Geog 241 will be listed as Geog 241/Geol 241, Elementary Meteorology, (4); or permission of instructor will be added to the prerequisites; and the course will carry liberal studies designation B1. (No APAC member challenged any of these minor changes, so they are automatically approved as announced.)
- b. Peil moved, Pratt seconded to approve Geol 101, Earth Science Today, (4); Geol 115, Physical Geology, (4); and Geol 116, Historical Geology, (4). Motion carried unanimously.
- c. Minor change announced: Geol 101, Geol 115, Geol 116 will each carry liberal studies designation B1.

3. Counseling and Human Development

- a. Moore moved, Papenfuss seconded to approve the following program changes:
 - i. Required number of credits will increase from 63 to 72.
 - ii. Two additional courses, Ed 567, Social and Cultural Foundations of Counseling, and Ed 566, Human Growth and Development for Counselors, will be required of all students.
 - iii. Ed 568, Community Counselor, will be required of students in the Community Counseling track.
 - iv. Nine credits of practicum will be required for all three program tracks or areas of specialization.Motion carried unanimously.
- b. Minor change announced: May be repeated will be added to Ed 571, Professional Contribution Seminar, (1).

4. APAC Subcommittee Report: Four-Credit Upper Division Graduation Requirement.

Subcommittee chair Olday reported that the subcommittee met October 6 at the written request of Vice President Barden to consider recommending approval to APAC of the following proposed implementation of the upper division graduation requirement proposed by the deans and the vice president:

Students can satisfy the Upper Division Graduation Requirement for advanced study outside of the major by completing four credits of upper division coursework according to the following guidelines:

-- Four credits of upper division courses selected from the list of courses approved for the Liberal Studies Program.

Or

-- Four credits of upper division coursework selected from the following list:

courses for performance in musical groups and ensembles, theatre productions, varsity athletics, and forensics.

courses for involvement in global and multicultural education in a relevant off-campus setting.

Olday reported that the APAC subcommittee felt this implementation model did not solve identified problems. Considerable discussion followed and Dr. Barden responded to questions and concerns.

Schobel moved, Papenfuss seconded to table the issue. The motion carried with Gracyk and Peil opposed.

Gracyk moved, Moore seconded to request that APAC members and others send comments to Midgarden within one week, and that the vice president and deans consider suggestions and recommendations and return to APAC as soon as practically possible. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Education and Early & Elementary Childhood

Gracyk moved, Moore seconded to approve program changes needed because of NDSU's semester calendar. Motion carried unanimously.

6. Graduate Program Suspension: Master of Science in Educational Theatre

Gracyk moved, Moore seconded to suspend the Master of Science in Educational Theatre. Motion carried unanimously.

Meeting adjourned at 5:30 pm.
