F A C T S A n d F I G U R E S

Founded in 1887 as a Normal School, the college has grown into a major Liberal Arts school with strong Teacher Education and Pre-Professional programs.

Enrollment: A student enrollment this year of 2,464 represents an all-time high and an increase of 126 per cent in the past five years. Students from 22 states and seven foreign countries are currently enrolled.

Faculty: Faculty members and administrators total 115, many with doctorate degrees from leading universities in the U. S. and abroad. A number have earned high honors for research, books and academic papers.

Physical Plant: Estimated value is \$12,137,000. Future construction will provide more residence halls, a humanities building and a student center.

Cost: About \$275 annually for tuition, fees and books. Board and room, \$220 per quarter. Scholarships of \$100 each are available to high-ranking entering freshmen. National Defense Loans of up to \$250 per quarter are available to qualified students.

Academic Program: In 1962-63 there are 41 areas in which students may major or minor in earning BA or BS degrees. The college also offers an MS in Education. MSC is fully accredited.
